Ours is a calendar replete with repetition. Like it or not, the High Holy Days recur with regularity, rushing closer regardless of requirements to write sermons, much less resolve to be better people in the year to come. In previous renditions ‘round this circle of life, we approached the season with reserve; Elul, that is the month prior to Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur, is traditionally a time to review days past, reconsider ways to improve, and reset with a clean slate. Under normal circumstances, Elul would be a good time to make amends for any transgressions by visiting with friends and family and beginning the task of apology.

And yet, we do not find ourselves in normal circumstances. The experience of visiting others is complicated by restrictions for safety and relocation to accommodate distance. Many of us have been so secluded, that even if we had the option to be in company, we would not have sufficient experience of recent social blunders to need make restitution at all. The solution to this exemption is not to skip the High Holy days, but rather to revise our expectations.

The promise of repetition afforded by our calendar, though it feels circular, is in fact more like a spiral. Like the way our young family members review the lessons and Hebrew words learned last year in Religious School, so too may we recogitate on what we have previously encountered. Yet, with each cycle of the year, we do not simply reiterate; a new year affords the chance to delve deeper, aim higher, and amplify our previous efforts.

May this holy time be one of renewal for us. Let us remember where we have been in recent months, the feelings of fear and seclusion, and let us reflect on how we may grow from here. May we come together for rejuvenation, revelation, and reclamation of our most important truths. Even if the form of our worship looks different from our previous memories, I believe we can retain the community that holds us together, revamp the spirit of our prayer, and return, in time, to our sacred home.

FROM THE RITUAL COMMITTEE

Like everything else this year, we will all remember these High Holidays are different from any we've experienced before. We've been working with Rabbi Benj for the past few months to create what we hope will be meaningful service opportunities we can all experience safely. Mt. Sinai is very lucky to have a wonderful new rabbi who has great ideas and is intellectually flexible and technologically comfortable enough to meet the challenges of helping us connect with our Jewish values and our spiritual center during a pandemic. He has been a joy to work with and we are excited for you all to get to know him better over the holidays and the years to come.

The program we have put together consists of a mix of pre-recorded streamed services, Zoom services and discussions and in-person Tashlich outdoor services as well as opportunities for individual and family reflection time in the sanctuary. Links for our streamed services will stay live, which gives congregants flexibility with their time. It's impossible to be late to a prerecorded service. Our Zoom services and discussions will allow us to see each other and interact without putting anyone's health at risk. There will be a few Tashlich services in different areas through the Days of Awe which will allow us to see each other in person, even if we need to stay at least six feet apart and wear masks. And for families wanting to spend some meditative time in the sanctuary and in front of the Ark, Rabbi Benj is happy to facilitate that, just call the synagogue to schedule a time.

If you need help with the technology, please reach out to Kristin or Marian or to any one of us and we will get you connected with someone who can help. Holiday prayer books are available for check out from the synagogue. If you live outside the Wausau area and would like to check out a prayer book, please let Kristin know.

The holidays will be different this year. Some things will be harder, others may be easier. We hope they will be deeply meaningful and that we will be able to treasure the time we spend together even though we are far apart.
